WINTER SOWING 2022

Seeds that work: Check seed package for any of the following phrases:

- Cold hardy
- Cold and moist stratification
- Direct sow outside in early spring (before last frost)
- Direct sow outside year-round
- Perennials
- Self-seeding
- Frost tolerant vegetables

Materials that you will need:

- Clean translucent or clear container with lid able to hold 3 to 4 inches of potting mix
- Scissors or sharp knife/box cutter to cut container and make drainage holes
- Potting Mix: enough to fill container 3 to 4 inches or about 1 inch below cut line
- Water Source
- Duct tape or clear packing tape
- ❖ Wax pencil or permanent Sharpie
- Label for inside container
- Seeds: plant depth according to package directions

Place outside where it can receive rain/snow—then forget it!
